As we continue to navigate the disruptions and challenges during this time of unprecedented uncertainties, I would like to express my gratitude to all of our members, leaders, supporters, partners, and communities for their demonstrated resilience. We responded to the needs in Haiti by sending medical and humanitarian supplies, engaging in medical missions to provide medical care relief, while maintaining our commitments to our scholarships program and community projects.

Many thanks to our Executive Board and committees, who have looked to our shared values—value of community, of inclusion, of social responsibility, collaboration and accountability to each other—to guide our responses. ancy Hagans, RN, CCRN, is president of the oldest nurses' union and association in the nation, representing more than 42,000 registered nurses across the state.

Ms. Hagans is a nurse and critical care expert who was first elected to NYSNA's Board in 2015. She was elected by the Board to the position of Treasurer in 2019 and is an active member of the union's Social Justice Committee.

Hagans is a native of Haiti and started her career as a surgical intensive care nurse at Maimonides Medical Center in Brooklyn in 1990. She became NYSNA's local bargaining unit president at the hospital in 1993. Currently, Hagans is the NYSNA Resource Nurse providing direct representation to NYSNA members at Maimonides. Hagans is also a trustee of the NYSNA Benefits Plan overseeing NYSNA health plan operations, Executive Council President of the 1,000 member bargaining unit, as well as a member of the Maimonides Staffing and Staff Development Committee.

With broad experience at Maimonides and in oversight of the union, Hagans is a strong and knowledgeable leader of RNs. Her election comes on the heels of the enactment of a safe staffing law that was passed during the 2021 legislative session, a major development for hospital nurses and the

patients for whom they care.

"We are a very powerful force for patients and their communities. Our voice is respected, our skills professional, our role central to society's healthcare. As I take on the responsibilities of the presidency, a landmark staffing law has just been achieved. What a victory! The law represents years of outreach and action by our members and fellow caregivers to communities whose collective voices were heard. The staffing law is a giant step forward towards our goal of equity in healthcare. Our fundamental belief that healthcare is a human right shall not be deterred." said Nancy Hagans, RN, CCRN.

MARGARETT ALEXANDRE PhD, RN, MS, FNYAM, ACUE Associate Professor Jonas Scholar Alumni Fellow, New York Academy of Medicine

r. Margarett Alexandre is an Associate Professor in the Department of Nursing at CUNY York College. She holds a bachelor's and a master's degree in Nursing with concentration in administration and education from Adelphi University. She earned her doctoral degree from the CUNY Graduate Center, where she earned the distinction of being selected as a Jonas Scholar. Drawing on her work in Haiti, her research agenda focuses on the physical and emotional health of Haitian Adults post 2010 earthquake in Haiti. She also pursues research interest in nursing students as millennial learners and innovative pedagogical approaches to teaching. Other interests include community initiatives both nationally and internationally. She also shares a great interest in transcultural nursing education, service-learning and active learning strategies. In the fall of 2012, she played a key role for the development of the first nursing elective and global nursing course in her nursing program. This course affords students and faculty the opportunity to travel and to work alongside healthcare professionals locally and globally. The students have worked for several years in Haiti and recently the Free Republic of Moldova-They have worked in a community clinic, elementary school, orphanage, and elderly home, providing care and education. Upon return, the students also participate in national and international conferences, to discuss their experiences and educational presentations to the communities.

Dr. Alexandre is engaged in a research addressing the incidence of hypertension among college students throughout the metropolitan area. During the quarantine period, she volunteered as a contact tracer for the City of New York, participated in radio educational programs to address signs and symptoms of Covid-19, and mental health impact. Dr. Alexandre work with the Haitian American Alliance's Covid Task Force, to also address Covid-19 in the Haitian communities, as well as in Haiti.

Dr. Alexandre has been a mentor to graduate, undergraduate and high school students. In 2016 she was a recipient of the Caribbean American Healthcare Award and was inducted as a Fellow of the New York Academy of Medicine. In 2018 Dr. Alexandre was recognized with a medal of valor, by the Military and Law Enforcement Veterans Association at their 4th Annual Women Recognition Award, for her humanitarian work in Haiti. She is the Founder of Mission Grandbois-which provides educational, nutritional, and healthcare support to children of the Grandbois community.

Dr. Alexandre is advisor to HANA of Hudson Valley and serves on the Editorial Board of HANA International. She also serves on the executive board of the Haitian Studies Institute (HSI) at Brooklyn College and is a reviewer for several nursing journals.

r. Aney Paul is a nurse, educator, organizer, volunteer, leader and a politician. She is a very hardworking person and she does her best wherever she is and whatever she does. Dr. Paul got elected as a County Legislator, first Ethnic Nurse from her Country to be a County Legislator and is on her third term.

This individual has a passion towards community and community health. She works tirelessly for the benefit of the community through many varied activities. She helps with advancement and promotion of the profession through involvement in professional associations, political involvement and community service she volunteers locally, nationally and internationally.

She volunteered to go to Haiti for a week for medical mission with Haitian Nurses Association after the hurricane in Haiti. She has the experience as a maternity nurse which helped her to save the life of a postpartum heavy bleeding patient came to the clinic in Haiti. During the Covid-19 she took leadership to organize a group of six NPs and a MD for community education and outreach. This great group includes experts of multi specialties and speak multi languages and presented few series of radio show on man-

agement of Covid -19 mainly for underserved residents of the county and more in progress. With recent Earthquake in Heiti Dr. Paul helped to organize thousands of dollars' worth donations for recent Earthquake in Haiti.

She is a CPR instructor she organizes Family and Friends CPR in the churches and community centers which helps to save lives. For more than five years she does parish nursing at the local church. She also helps the community in need by collecting winter coats/jackets during December and give to organizations who take care of homeless people. She is a member of many organizations and she volunteers as Health Educator or helping to organize Health Fair.

She is been involved in the community organizations and professional organizations. She is the Founding President of Indian Nurses Association of New York(INANY), Founding member of National Indian association of Nurses of America(NANIA), Founding President, Advisory Board Chair for National Indian Nurse Practitioners' Association of America(NINPAA). She has received many awards for her services to community and to the nursing profession. She received the Nursing Excellence Award in India from Prime Minister Indira Gandhi and many from the

During her term as a legislator, she had sponsored and supported many resolutions related to health. She sponsored NYSNA resolution for "Safe Staffing" which passed unanimously at the legislative body of 17 members. She sponsored a resolution about E-cigarettes and made policy changes in the county adding e-cigarettes policy into smoking policy. She also introduced Tobacco 21 law in the county and one of the first county to introduce this law and many counties followed and it became a state law. She sponsored the resolution "revenge porn," (the nonconsensual sharing of intimate photos) at the legislature and it became a state law. She supported Family leave which refers to employees can take off from work to care for themselves, care for their family members, or bond with a newborn child. She supported the bill to provide more frequent or longer break periods for individuals with medical needs arising from pregnancy, childbirth, or expressing milk for mothers. This NP Legislator always a promoter for a healthy community.

Dr. Paul works in many capacities, as a Nurse Practitioner, an Educator, a politician, and a Leader. She is working as a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner at a private clinic, an Adjunct Professor at a local College and Vice Chair of the County Legislature.



DO YOUR PEOPLE, OR YOUR COUNTRY, HAITI, GET A BREAK?

Thile the members of HANA of Hudson Valley, New York, Inc., are coming together to celebrate Bravery, Resilience, and Excellence that Frontline Nurses or Healthcare Workers exhibit throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, we are witnessing the suffering of the Haitian people everywhere, in Haiti and abroad. It started with the political unrest that plagued Haiti for decades, culminating in numerous killings and kidnappings of Haitians in their homeland. Haitians living in Haiti and the diaspora are stressed and traumatized by the constant physical and emotional violence.

Compounding the situation, on July 7, 2021, Haitians learned in horror about the assassination of President Jovenel Moise in his own home. Then, on August 14, 2021, as our Haitians, brothers and sisters continued to mourn the unexpected death of the President or became numb by his brutal killing, mother nature inflicted a 7.2 magnitude earthquake on Haiti's Southern Peninsula, including Les Cayes, Nippes, and Jeremie Grand' Anse. Haitians everywhere mobilized to help in the rescue and

recovery efforts. However, a few days after the catastrophe, Tropical Storm Grace dumped heavy rains, and strong winds battered the Southern Peninsula, making rescue efforts more difficult as death tolls increased. One of my colleagues who wanted to be empathetic asked me the following question: "Do your people or your country, Haiti, get a break?"

While I am still trying to figure out if Haitians get a break or not, I am watching a humanitarian crisis unfolding at the Texas-Mexico Border. Haitian refugees made the trip from South America to obtain asylum in the United States. Thus far, the response of the American government has been cold and callous. The refugees are not granted asylum. Instead, they are deported to Haiti with no questions asked. Shortly after the arrival of a group of deportees in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, a young woman stated to a reporter, "Nobody told us we were going back to Haiti." They were all in shock; it appeared that they were not ready to return home. Again, "do your people or Haiti get a break?

Moreover, the COVID-19 pandemic remains a challenge to the entire world despite the COVID vaccine access. As you can see, we have so much to unpack, and 2021 is not even over. Therefore, HANA of Hudson Valley, New York, Inc. invites the members, Frontline Nurses, Healthcare Workers, or Nurse Scholars, to reflect on bravery, resilience, and excellence or make your world visible to others. Or you may choose to answer the question, "do our people or Haiti get a break? Our next Newsletter volume will be published in March 2022. Please submit your article to the Newsletter Committee no later than January 31, 2022. Papers or articles will be reviewed and vetted before publication.

Thank you for all the extraordinary things you do for humankind.




