Personally, I am deeply committed to HANA and have been for almost two decades. I will continue to give, advocate and volunteer for your well-being.


Once again, I thank you for your many compassionate actions, enduring support and generosity and your devoted partnership and friendship over the years. I remain grateful, humbled and inspired.

# Keynote Speaker





Dr. Selena A Gilles, DNP, ANP-BC, CNEd, FNYAM

Dr Selena A Gilles is Clinical Associate Professor and Associate Dean of the Undergraduate Program at New York University Rory Meyers College of Nursing. She is an Affiliate Faculty member of the Hartford Institute for Geriatric Nursing (HIGN) where she serves as Co-Director of HIGN Scholars Program. Dr Gilles is also an Affiliate Associate Professor at Howard University College of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences and Volunteer Associate Professor for the State University of Haiti.

Dr Gilles has a DNP from Monmouth University (2014), a MS in Adult Health Nursing from Hunter College, City University of New York, (Cum Laude, 2010) and a BS with a major in Nursing degree from Long Island University (With Honors, 2005). Dr Gilles is a certified Clinical Nurse Educator and is also certified in Critical Care Nursing. Dr Gilles has been an Adult Nurse Practitioner for 13 years, specializing in Neuro and Pain Management.

Dr Gilles is known for creating and implementing nontraditional immersive teaching/learning innovations to address nationally identified nursing education issues that will enhance student learning/program outcomes. She is regarded as a leader and prelicensure nursing education expert who has implemented curricular innovations that have been evidenced-based, creative and effective teaching strategies that span across multiple courses at Meyers and settings outside of Meyers, having a significant impact on student academic success and role transitions. Her contributions have helped enhance the nursing curriculum, filling identified gaps and answering the new Essentials call for all entry-level professional nurses to have knowledge and proficiencies to practice across a variety of settings in the spheres of wellness/disease prevention and chronic disease management.

Dr Gilles is passionate about the management of acute and chronic pain, as well as opioid overdose prevention. She is the Program Director of the Greater NYC Black Nurses Association Opioid Overdose Prevention Program. She has strong community advocacy and passion for global health, currently working with organizations aimed to serve the underprivileged and underserved communities in Haiti, Ghana, and Nigeria. She has been on seven medical missions. Dr. Gilles is currently a member of six professional organizations/associations, including serving as Past President and current Treasurer of Meyers' Sigma Upsilon Chapter, and Programming and Community Service Committee Chair for the Greater NYC Black Nurses Association. She currently serves as the Vice President of DNP's of Color. Dr Gilles is an NLN LEAD Alum (2019) Penn Wharton Nurse Executive Leader Alum (2020). She has received the NBNA Under 40 Award (2019), Nurse of the Year Award for Community Service (2020), and Advanced Practice Nurse of the Year Award (2022). She has also received the Leota P Brown Community Service Award from Chi Eta Phi Sorority, Inc (2021). Dr Gilles is the recipient of the GNYCBNA Nurse of the Year for Community Service (2021) and the NYU Meyers Humanitarian Award (2021). Dr Gilles is also a Fellow of the New York Academy of Medicine (2020). This fall, Dr Gilles will be inducted as a Fellow into the American Academy of Nursing and Academy of Nursing Education.







Jean-Herve Mondestin, MSOL, RCP, BS-RRT

"I was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. In the mid 1980's I migrated to the United States in Spring Valley NY. I graduated from Spring Valley High School and left for the United States Army in which I served six years. After serving in the Military,

I found myself attached to the community and I became a Deputy Sheriff, which I have been for the past 20 years. I have been blessed to serve the community at all levels. In 2010, I spent several days in Haiti assisting the humanitarian aid from the earthquake devastation.

Over the years, I attended Rockland Community College where I received an associate degree in respiratory therapy. I continued to pursue higher education at Nyack College, where I obtained a Bachelor Degree of Science in Management and a Master of Science in Organizational Leadership. I am currently a member of several organizations, including but not limited to: Bergen Community College Advisory Board Member, Haitian American Law Enforcement United, NYSFOP, Rockland County Shields and executive board Member of Rockland County

Sheriff TPU/Relief officers.

Proud father of three children; Brian is currently serving in the US Navy as a Division Commander and twins Gabriella and Justin are high school seniors.

My life passion is to serve and help people. As a Deputy Sheriff and Director of Respiratory Care Services and Sleep Medicine, I have been able to help people with the hope of changing their lives for the better and making a difference one day at a time. I am a recipient of the United States National Defense Service medal and accommodation letters of recognition from the US Senate and Rockland County Legislator."







Xi Lambda Lambda Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Xi Lambda Lambda Chapter was founded in Pomona, New York (Rockland County) on September 25, 2003 by a group of graduate and professional men. They had a vision of organizing a chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc which would serve the growing county and community.

Xi Lambda Lambda has performed many of the fraternity's mandated programs from Achievement Week to the Blood Drive to the Talent Hunt. We implemented and coordinated a Scholastic Aptitude Test preparatory course for Rockland area high school students with the assistance of members of Phi Delta Kappa, a Rockland African American teaching sorority. In 2006 launched our first Xi Lambda Lambda/Charles Drew Blood Drive at the Palisades Mall in West Nyack, New York. An added feature to the blood drive was the inclusion of a bone marrow drive. For the past three years Xi Lambda Lambda has provided college scholarships to four Rockland County male students who attend public high schools and who will be matriculating to college after graduating.

In compliance with Omega Psi Phi's National Social Action Program Xi Lambda Lambda has performed voter registration drives. In our most recent drive during

the primary season, we registered well over 150 new voters. The drives were conducted at Rockland Community College in Suffern, New York.

In March of 2007 we embarked on our flagship program, the Rockland Omega AcaDemy (ROAD), a mentoring program for African American/Latino in grades 5 through 11. The program encompasses public speaking, financial literacy classes, study skills, etiquette training and host of other skills we feel will help the young men prosper and thrive in this challenging world.

The chapter chartered a bus to take the ROAD mentees, their parents, and others in the Rockland community to the presidential inauguration of America 's first African American President, Barack Obama in the nation's capital. The mentees were also taken to the movie premiere of "The Express." Future plans for the ROAD mentees include traveling to upstate New York this year on an outdoor weekend camping trip. The program is funded in part through grants written by our tax-exempt financial arm, the Rockland Omega Community Development Foundation, Inc, a 501(c) (3) organization.

During the years 2004 and 2005 we held an art auction with great success. In 2007 the chapter presented its first Jazz Brunch. The jazz brunch, which is held on the third Sunday of February, has not only been a financial success but serves as great entertainment and enjoyment for those that have attended. This event has become a staple in Rockland that sells itself.

The chapter held its first two Talent Hunt Programs in 2008 and 2009. On Sunday, March 16, 2008, Xi Lambda Lambda was selected to host the Corridor 5 Memorial Service. The venue for this program was the Pilgrim Baptist Church in Nyack, New York. Over 100 members of the fraternity from Long Island to Albany as well as the surrounding states were in attendance.







Radio Panik is a privately owned radio, known as the multi and intercultural, a safe place for debates and a great platform for creativity.

Radio Panik was founded in 1983, an initiative of a group of people fighting against racism and people's rights. Their motivation, since then remained the same: The objectives of the association are to contribute, first and foremost by diffusing news, by promoting the social structure of the population in several regions. The goal is to assure the real emancipation of individuals with respect regardless of their stand in cultural and political debates.

### Panik Radio WRCR AM 1700

Radio Panik has been part of the very first generation of radio promoting freedom of speech and fighting on behalf of the greater good of knowledge. Throughout the years, Radio Panik never lost their vision, to promote LIBERTY, INDEPENDENCE, AND DIVERSITY. The radio had different addresses at Saint-Josse and at Schaerbeek, hence the reason radio Panik has covered both local and international news, by welcoming the diverse community which makes Bruxelles the center of

a vast cultural space without borders, which led to accepting parallels expressions within the radio, allowing something different emerged.

Today, Radio Panik has had the support of the French Minister of Communication since 2006, and since 2011 the radio has been recognized as a permanent association education platform. Since 2008, Radio Panik has had the status of "radio associative and expression a vocation Culturelle ou d'education permanente'. Radio Panik promotes association and expression of cultural vocation and permanent education.







Dr. Frances Pratt
Past President of the
Nyack Branch NAACP

Dr. Frances Ethel Powell Pratt is a native of Chester County, SC, the tenth child of the Powell family. She received her primary education in the Chester County public school system and graduated from Friendship Junior College in Rock Hill, South Carolina before studying Religious Education at Barber Scotia College in Concord, North Carolina. After relocating to Nyack, New York, her compassion for helping others led her to later enroll in the Nursing Program at SUNY Rockland Community College in Suffern, New York and after earning a nursing degree and passing the New York State Board of Nursing Licensure Examination to receive her RN, she climbed the ranks to become the first African American to serve in the position of Head Nurse in the Emergency Room of Nyack Hospital.

After retiring in January 2000, Dr. Pratt was called back to full time duty in August 2001 where she was appointed to administration to become the manager of the newly formed Employee Health Services. The Nyack Hospital Emergency Waiting Room is named after Frances E. Pratt, and has a mounted portrait and plaque of Dr. Pratt on its wall. The hospital also established a Positive Image Scholarship

Award in her honor to be given annually in her name; and in 2005 paid tribute to Dr. Pratt by planting and dedicating a Peace Rose Garden in her honor on the campus of the hospital. Her picture also adorns the wall of the Legislative Building, County Seat of Rockland in New City, and June 29, 2005 was declared "Frances Pratt Day" in Rockland County by then County Legislature Chairwoman, Harriet Cornell.

Described by an associate as a "soldier for social justice and civil rights in Rockland County", she is respected by all who know her. She served as the president of the Nyack Branch NAACP for over 40 years. Although recently retired, she continues to champion the rights of the marginalized and underserved in Rockland. Dr. Pratt was awarded an honorary doctorate degree from Nyack College in 2015 and her outstanding service, splendid leadership, dynamic personality, and love of God have earned her many more prestigious awards and honors from nearly every facet of the Rockland Community. She was recently awarded the County's highest honor – the Key to the County – by the Rockland County Legislature, and the Village Board of South Nyack has renamed the street where she has lived for over 50 years "Dr. Frances Pratt Way". Dr. Pratt's stalwart dedication to serving humanity is a blossom that was planted during her childhood, by her third-grade teacher who shared this adage – "If a task is once begun, never leave it until its done.... Be the labor great or small, do it well or not at all." We all owe that teacher a debt of gratitude!

Dr. Pratt was married to the late Marshall Pratt and has one daughter, Carol Paul; three grandchildren, Gerald, Jermaine and Patricia; and three great-grandchildren, Hannah, Nicholas and Mason. Her family remains the source of her greatest pride, satisfaction and accomplishment.
