Maxine Smalling
Chief Executive Nursing Officer
New York State Office of Mental
Health (OMH)

Maxine Smalling is the Chief Executive Nursing Officer for the New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH) and a registered nurse with more than 30 years of clinical, administrative, policy and executive nursing leadership experience in various psychiatric and addiction settings. Ms. Smalling is a graduate of the Helene Fuld College of Nursing, has a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing from The Sage Colleges and a Master of Science in Nursing from Excelsior College. She is a member of the American Nurses Association, American Psychiatric Nurses Association, the Northeast New York Professional Nurses Organization and the Sigma Global Nursing Excellence, Tau Kappa at-Large Chapter.

Ms. Smalling professional nursing career began as a charge nurse on the inpatient psychiatry unit at North Central Bronx Hospital, where she discovered her passion for psychiatric nursing, while caring for individuals living with a serious mental illness. She gained public health nursing experience working as a school nurse for the NYC Department of Health and later extensive community mental health experience working as a visiting nurse caring for individuals living at home in the urban cities and rural towns of Saratoga, Rensselaer and Albany Counties. Her experience caring for individuals with psychiatric and substance use disorders lead her to her role as nurse manager for a Methadone maintenance treatment program, where her efforts to provide vaccines against Hepatitis A and B were recognized by the New York State Association of Substance Abuse Providers as a best practice for methadone maintenance treatment. Later as the program director for an OASAS 822 outpatient clinic, she collaborated with the medical team to provide Buprenorphine treatment for individuals with opioid use disorder, the first OASAS 822 clinic in Upstate NY to provide medication assisted treatment (MAT) in this setting.

In 2007, Ms. Smalling joined the NYS OMH Hudson River Field Office where she collaborated with DOH on Adult Homes serving as the psychiatric nurse expert during interagency reviews of adult homes and the provision of case management services to adult home clients with serious mental illness (SMI). In her current role as Chief Executive Nursing Officer and a member of the OMH Executive Team, Ms. Smalling is providing nursing leadership to address nursing issues systemically, ensure the presence of a nursing voice in policy making and working collaboratively with the Chief Medical Officer and OMH Executive Leadership Team to set the agencies strategic policies and plans. Ms. Smalling provides leadership and consultations to OMH 24 Chief Nursing Officers to drive the professionalization of the nursing workforce and actively promoting the dissemination of evidenced-based clinical nursing practices system wide.

Ms. Smalling is passionate about psychiatric nursing and committed to driving the uptake of evidence-based, innovative, cost-effective, high quality, safe and compassionate mental health care, to assist every individual to achieve their highest level of recovery including sustaining community living. This commitment includes identifying barriers to accessing services, address disparities in care for the individuals living with a mental illness, driving excellence in psychiatric nursing, developing and implementing new community models to fill the identified gaps in the continuum of care, addressing barriers to care, providing and supporting learning opportunities to increase the knowledge and competence of OMH nurses and therapy aides, including "growing our own psychiatric nurses" to meet the nursing staffing coverage needs at OMH 24 hospitals and programs.

Ms. Smalling' collaborations and accomplishments include the successful implementation of OMH State Operated Tobacco free campus-wide policies at 20 Facilities, NYS unlimiting the Medicaid benefits for Tobacco Use Disorder treatment, the development and implementation of the OMH Skilled Nursing Facilities Enhanced Support Program(SNF-ESP), a new community model, providing knowledge transfer through ECHO Clinics, Teletherapy and Telepsychiatry services to improve the knowledge of primary care providers to meet the mental health needs of individuals in skilled nursing facilities, collaborated on advancing the use of psychiatric nurse practitioners throughout OMH State Operated services primarily in physician shortage areas, successfully advocated and secured the resources to develop the Inaugural OMH NP Fellowship Program, increased the percentage of OMH registered nurses with a BSN degree, collaborated with other OMH colleagues and several academic institutions to increase clinical affiliation agreements from 6 to 46 and the number of nursing and nurse practitioner students benefitting from clinical placements at OMH facilities, NYS OMH becoming a Watson Caring Science Institute Affiliate with the adoption of Caring Science as the theoretical framework for OMH psychiatric mental health nursing practice. Ms. Smalling presented at various conferences, collaborated on scholarly articles and is the recipient of the Psychiatric Nurse of the Year Award at North Central Bronx Hospital, The Albany Common Council 2019, 10th Ward, Black History Month honoree and on March 7, 2019, awarded the NYS Empire Star Public Service Award for exemplifying the highest standards of public service, 2022, the Russell Sage Women of Influence Award 2022 and in 2025 she received a nomination for OMH Employee of the Year and the 2025 APNA Award for Excellence in Leadership-RN

Chief Executive Officer Anne Kauffman Nolon, MPH has provided vision and leadership to Sun River Health as Chief Executive Officer for nearly 50 years. She is responsible for guiding the growth and development of one of the largest community health center systems in the United States from a single primary care site in Peekskill, New York to a delivery system of nearly 50 directly-operated Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) throughout the Hudson Valley, New York City, and Long Island, along with additional health centers through sub-recipient agreements, mobile health centers, and a regional migrant voucher program serving an 11-county agricultural region in southeastern New York State.

With the guidance of the Board of Directors, Anne has implemented broad goals that have culminated in a staff of over 2,000 serving more than

250,000 patients throughout the organization. Under her leadership, Sun River Health is Joint Commission-Accredited and recognized by the National Committee on Quality Assurance (NCQA) as an Advanced Patient Centered Medical Home. In 2018, she led Hudson River Health Care through a successful merge with Brightpoint Health, a network of FQHCs in all five boroughs of New York City, resulting in the combined organization now known as Sun River Health. Anne is a member of the National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC) and Vice Chair of its Health Policy Committee. She serves on the Board of Directors for the National Center for Farmworker Health and previously served as a member of the National Advisory Council on Migrant

She is passionate about providing high quality obstetric and gynecologic care to women around the globe through a human rights lens. She is the System Director of Complex Family Planning for NYC Health + Hospitals, and she has focused on improving quality and access for contraception and abortion services across the hospital system.
